

he information reflected in this edition of the Credit Bureau Monitor covers the period from the quarter ended March 2011 to March 2015, and is based on data held by registered credit bureaus in terms of the National Credit Act No 34 of 2005.

Summary

Credit bureaus create consumer credit profiles based on credit information received from credit providers, courts and utility service providers. The National Credit Regulator (NCR) regulates and monitors registered credit bureaus and the quality of their data.

As at the end of March 2015:

- Credit bureaus held records for 23.11 million credit-active consumers, an increase
 of 1.2% when compared to the 22.84 million in the previous quarter. Consumers
 classified in good standing increased by 118,000, to 12.70 million consumers. As a
 percentage of the total number of credit-active consumers, this reflects a decrease of
 0.1% quarter-on-quarter and 0.8% year-on-year.
- The number of consumers with impaired records increased by 146,000 to 10.41 million, from 10.26 million in the previous quarter.
- The number of accounts decreased from 82.13 million in the previous quarter to 82.04 million. The number of impaired accounts increased from 22.28 million to 22.38 million when compared to the previous quarter, an increase of 91,000 quarter-on-quarter and 3.11 million year-on-year.
- A total of 336.08 million enquiries were made on consumer credit records, a decrease
 of 22.3% quarter-on-quarter and an increase of 0.7% year-on-year. Enquiries initiated
 by consumers accounted for 12.76 million of all enquiries, a decrease of 19.1% quarteron-quarter and 10.9% year-on-year.
- Of the total enquiries made on consumer records, enquiries from banks and other financial institutions accounted for 74.9%, enquiries from retailers accounted for 3.0% and enquiries from telecommunication providers accounted for 3.9%. Banks and other financial institutions' enquiries decreased by 25.7% from the previous quarter, retailers increased by 3.1% and telecommunication providers decreased by 15.1%.
- The number of credit reports issued to consumers increased to 149,222. Of the total credit reports issued, 69.5% (103,771) were issued without charge, and the remaining 30.5% (45,451) were issued with charge.
- There were 22,912 disputes lodged on information held on consumer credit records for the quarter ended March 2015, an increase of 0.4% quarter-on-quarter and a decrease of 8.4% year-on-year.

National Credit Regulator

Introduction

The information reflected in this Credit Bureau Monitor covers the period from the quarter ended March 2011 to March 2015.

Comparisons in this report: "quarter-on-quarter" refers to a comparison between the March 2015 and December 2014 quarters, and "year-on-year" refers to a comparison between the March 2015 and March 2014 quarters.

Credit-active consumers

There were 23.11 million credit-active consumers as at the end of March 2015

Credit bureaus held records for more than 47.02 million individuals on their databases as at the end of March 2015. From these records, 23.11 million (49.1%) were credit-active and the remaining records contained only identification information and no credit activity. The number of credit-active consumers increased by 264,000 quarter-on-quarter and 1.40 million year-on-year.

The percentage of consumers in good standing decreased this quarter

Consumers classified in good standing increased by 118,000 to 12.70 million consumers. As a percentage of the total number of credit-active consumers, this reflects a decrease of 0.1% quarter-on-quarter and 0.8% year-on-year. Of the total 23.11 million credit-active consumers, 55.0% were in good standing.


The number of consumers with impaired records (the inverse of those in good standing) increased by 146,000 to 10.41 million. The percentage of credit-active consumers with impaired records increased to 45.0%, comprising of 22.4% of consumers in three months or more in arrears, 12.2% of consumers with adverse listings, and 10.4% of consumers with judgments and administration orders.

A detailed breakdown of the nature of impairments is provided in Table 1 and Figure 1.

Consumer accounts

There were 82.04 million accounts on record at the bureaus as at the end of March 2015

At the end of the reporting quarter there were 82.04 million accounts recorded at registered credit bureaus. This was a decrease of 0.1% quarter-on-quarter and an increase of 6.3% year-on-year.

The percentage of accounts in good standing decreased this quarter

Of the 82.04 million accounts, 59.66 million (72.7%) were classified as in good standing, a negative variance of 0.2% quarter-on-quarter and 2.3% year-on-year.

As at the end of March 2015:


- 64.7% of accounts were classified as current (decreased quarter-on-quarter by 0.5% and year-on-year by 1.4%).
- 8.0% had missed one or two instalments (increased quarter-on-quarter by 0.4% and decreased year-on-year by 0.9%).
- 19.8% had missed three or more instalments (decreased quarter-on-quarter by 0.3% and year-on-year by 2.5%).
- 5.1% had adverse listings (increased quarter-on-quarter by 0.5% and year-on-year by 5.1%).
- 2.3% had judgments or administration orders (decreased quarter-on-quarter by 0.1% and year-on-year by 0.4%).

Credit market activity

Enquiries made on consumer records decreased for the quarter

In the quarter ended March 2015, 336.08 million enquiries were made. This was a decrease of 22.3% quarter-on-quarter and an increase of 0.7% year-on-year. Enquiries done in bulk by banks and other financial institutions formed the largest portion of all enquiries.

- 12.76 million enquiries were made due to consumers seeking credit (decreased by 19.1% quarter-on-quarter and 10.9% year-on-year).
- 0.81 million enquiries were related to telecommunication services (increased by 5.6% quarter-on-quarter and 13.0% year-on-year).
- 17.51 million enquiries were made for tracing/debt collection purposes (decreased by 1.8% quarter-on-quarter and increased by 48.2% year-on-year).
- 304.99 million enquiries were made for other purposes excluding those purposes mentioned above, e.g. account management and contact information update (decreased by 23.4% quarter-on-quarter and 0.6% year-on-year).



Enquiry sectoral analysis

In the quarter ended March 2015, 251.74 million enquiries were made by banks and other financial institutions, a decrease of 25.7% quarter-on-quarter and 9.5% year-on-year. Retailers made 10.03 million enquiries on consumer records, which was an increase of 3.1% quarter-on-quarter and a decrease of 15.6% year-on-year. Enquiries made by telecommunication providers decreased by 15.1% quarter-on-quarter and increased by 45.7% year-on-year, to 13.04 million in March 2015 quarter. Enquiries made by debt collection agencies increased by 61.7% quarter-on-quarter and 70.6% year-on-year, to 4.87 million in March 2015 quarter. Enquiries made by all other entities showed a quarter-on-quarter decrease of 14.3% and an increase of 77.1% year-on-year, to 56.40 million.

Figure 6: All enquiries – distribution according to sectors



Credit bureau activity

Demand for credit reports increased for the quarter


Of the total 149,222 credit reports issued to consumers at their request during the quarter ended March 2015, 69.5% (103,771) were issued without charge, and the remaining 30.5% (45,451) were issued with charge. The total number of credit reports issued increased by 2.3% quarter-on-quarter and decreased by 11.6% year-on-year.

Consumer disputes


In the quarter ended March 2015, 22,912 disputes were lodged in respect of the accuracy of the information recorded on consumer credit records. This was an increase of 0.4% quarter-on-quarter and a decrease of 8.4% year-on-year. More disputes were resolved in favour of complainants (15,349) as compared to disputes where credit records remained unchanged (3,371).

Definitions

Terms used in this report	Definitions
Credit-active consumers	Consumers obligated to pay credit providers and/or service providers, etc. These obligations result in transactional entries on the consumer's credit record at the credit bureaus.
Impaired record	A record on which a consumer and/or any of the accounts, are either classified as three or more payments or months in arrears, or which has an "adverse listing", or that reflects a judgment or administration order.
Good standing	An account or consumer showing as current or on which the client has not missed more than one or two instalments, which has no adverse listings and has no judgments.
Adverse listing	Accounts with adverse classifications such as 'handed over' and/or 'written-off'.
Current	A consumer or account is up-to-date with payments and has not missed any instalment over the period of the credit agreement.

- 1. Where values have been rounded off, the percentage calculations and summed totals are calculated off the unrounded values
- 2. Refer to the NCR website for complete tables of thirty two quarters from June 2007 to March 2015.
